SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT PATROL OFFICER AWARD CERTIFICATE PRESENTATION

Officers Thobaben, and Rasmussen responded to an accident where a vehicle struck a bridge, overturned into the river, and in an attempt to save a life, not considering their own safety, they dove into the cold Little Wolf River and attempted to gain entry to the car. Unfortunately, the driver could not be released from the car and died in that accident. Later that day, off-duty Officer Bosquez responded to Flease's Campground for a person who had a heart attack. Sheriff Liebe presented the officers with a letter of commendation for meritorious service while performing their duty as patrolmen for the Waupaca County Sheriff's Department on September 2, 2000 at 10:05 p.m. You responded and galentely reacted with a great amount of valor and heroism attempting to free Amy Wernberg from her submerged vehicle in the Little Wolf River. Your hard work, professionalism, and can-do attitude displayed throughout the crisis have not gone unnoticed. Your selfless service and dedication are a great credit to yourself, the Waupaca County Sheriff's Department, and law enforcement as a profession.

REPORT NO. 12 (00-01) Teen Court

Connie Abert, John Snider, and Judge Hoffmann explained the Teen Court concept and answered questions.

RESOLUTION NO. 18 (2000-2001) Teen Court

WHEREAS, exploration of alternative means for reducing recidivism among youthful offenders should be encouraged; and

WHEREAS, a Teen Court Program for such offenders is seen by many as one promising intervention, because through such a program:

- Communities will see youth being held accountable for their actions,
- More thought will be given to parental responsibilities,
- An organized county-wide community service program will strengthen connections between communities and youth,

- Youth will be brought together for a positive purpose, during a challenging period of their lives, and will gain a sense of responsibility as they encourage peers to stop negative behaviors reflecting on all youth, and
- Adult volunteers will have greater opportunities to make a difference in the lives of youth; and

WHEREAS, a Juvenile Justice Formula Grant may be available to fund a Waupaca County Teen Court Program through June 30, 2002;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Waupaca County Board of Supervisors hereby:

- 1. Authorizes the filing of an application for such a grant; and
- Hereby directs and authorizes the Teen Court Executive Committee and Advisory Committee to act in connection with such application and provide such additional information as may be required; and
- 3. Hereby authorizes the receipt of such a grant award, and the use of such funds to establish and maintain a Waupaca County Teen Court Program; and
- 4. Encourages the solicitation of sources other than county tax dollars to help continue the Waupaca County Teen Court Program after June 30, 2002.

AMEND CHAPTER 7.04 OF THE WAUPACA COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES

SUBJECT: SPEED RESTRICTION – County Trunk Highway "K"

WHEREAS, in conjunction with the CTH 22/CTH "K"/King Road intersection project, the CTH "K" horizontal alignment has been reconstructed at a 35 mile per hour speed; and

WHEREAS, the new pedestrian and vehicular traffic has experienced significant increases; and

WHEREAS, a review of the following described highway and the maximum permissible speed at which vehicles can be operated on said highway which is reasonably safe and prudent has been established pursuant to Sec. 346.57 and Sec. 349.11 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Waupaca County Board of Supervisors do hereby ordain as follows:

1. 35 miles per hour from 0.25 miles south of STH 22 to the STH 22 intersection.

This ordinance shall be effective upon erection of standard signs giving notice thereof.

WHEREAS, Waupaca County revenues are negatively impacted as a result of untimely received checks.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Waupaca County Board of Supervisors does hereby ordain and direct that all county departments not accept checks that are 180 days old.

EFFECTIVE DATE: Upon adoption of and publication by the County Board of Supervisors, the Ordinance will be in full force and effect within Waupaca County.

AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE NO. 1 Town of Lebanon, C-G to RS-20 Z-6-00

Parcel #11-12-14-8, Z-6-00, Leroy Raddatz in Sec. 12, Town of Lebanon for a Zoning Map Amendment from C-G (General Commercial) zone to RS-20 (Residential Single-Family, 20,000 Sq. Ft. Lot Minimum) zone for an existing single-family dwelling.

An amendment to amend the Waupaca County Zoning Ordinance by changing the zoning classification of certain specified lands located in part of the SE ¼ of the NE ¼ of Sec. 12, Town of Lebanon, lying along Church Street, Fire Number E-9690, Waupaca County, Wisconsin, on approximately .2 acres.

Subject matter of this ordinance having been duly referred to and considered by the Waupaca County Planning and Zoning Committee and public hearing having been held after the giving of requisite notice of said hearing and a recommendation thereon reported to the Board of Supervisors, Waupaca County, Wisconsin as required by Section 59.97 of the Wisconsin Statutes, said Board does ordain as follows:

Section 1. The Zoning Map entitled Lebanon Township, Detail Map B-9, Waupaca County is hereby amended by changing the zoning classification of the area shown on the attached map, which is made a

part of the ordinance from C-G (General Commercial) zone to RS-20 (Residential Single-Family, 20,000 Sq. Ft. Lot Minimum) zone.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect in the Town of Lebanon upon filing with the County Clerk of Waupaca County a certified copy of a resolution of the Town Board of Supervisors of said town approving said ordinance or 40 days after the adoption of the ordinance by County Board, unless a certified copy of a resolution disapproving the amendment is filed within ten (10) days with the County Clerk within that time.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with or in contravention of provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

WHEREAS, Waupaca County will submit a final report to the Department which describes all river protection project activities, achievements and problems, comparing the actual

program with the activities and objectives proposed in the application, including samples of our information-education brochures, data collected and documentation of the project costs.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED that the Waupaca County Board of Supervisors does hereby requests the funds and assistance available from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources under the River Protection Grant Program and will comply with state rules for the program; and

HEREBY AUTHORIZES Eunice Lawrence to act on behalf of Waupaca County to: submit an application to the State of Wisconsin for financial aid for river protection purposes, sign documents, and take necessary action to undertake, direct, and complete an approved protection project.
