RESOLUTION NO. 32 (2001-2001) INITIAL RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING NOT TO EXCEED \$5,000,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION PROMISSORY NOTES FOR HIGHWAY PROJECTS, HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT IMPROVEMENTS, PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT AND FAIRGROUNDS IMPROVEMENTS

RESOLVED, that Waupaca County, Wisconsin borrow an amount not to exceed \$5,000,000 by issuing its general obligation promissory notes for the public purpose of providing for the construction, improvement and maintenance of highways and bridges, Highway Department improvements, Parks and Recreation Department improvements and Fairgrounds improvements. There be and thereby is levied on all taxable property in the County a direct, annual tax in such years and in such amounts as are sufficient to pay when due the principal and interest on such notes.
