AMEND CHAPTER 7.04 OF THE WAUPACA COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES

SUBJECT: SPEED RESTRICTION – COUNTY TRUNK HIGHWAY "Y" (High Street)

WHEREAS, the Village of Embarrass has requested a change in the speed zone ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation has completed a traffic and engineering investigation on the following described highway; and

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation traffic and engineering investigation recommended the speed zone change; and

WHEREAS, the maximum possible speed at which vehicles can be operated on said highway that is reasonably safe and prudent has been established pursuant to Sec. 346.57 and Sec. 349.11 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Waupaca County Board of Supervisors do hereby ordain as follows:

1. Thirty-Five (35) miles per hour from CTH "C" north approximately 0.2 miles to the existing twenty-five (25) miles per hour speed zone.

This Ordinance shall be effective upon erection of standard signs giving notice thereof.

RESOLUTION NO. 51 (2001-2002)

AUTHORIZING THE PARTICIPATION IN A 12-COUNTY WISCONSIN TECHNOLOGY ZONE APPLICATION

- WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Legislature has enacted Section 560.02(4) and Section 560.96 Wis. Statutes to direct the Department of Commerce to designate Technology Zones and to make available certain tax benefits for certified businesses within the eight (8) zones to be created; and
- **WHEREAS**, Waupaca County has benefited from participation with other counties in regional approaches to education, planning, transportation, and Economic Development; and
- **WHEREAS**, an increased level of understanding and cooperation between agencies, municipalities, and counties would improve opportunities for economic development in Northeast Wisconsin; and
- **WHEREAS**, Waupaca County would benefit from the existence of a Technology Zone by attracting new investments and creating quality jobs; and
- **WHEREAS**, personnel from this County, the <u>Bay-Lake</u> Regional Planning Commission, and other economic development agencies in Northeast Wisconsin will participate in the preparation of the application and will lend their technical expertise in evaluating businesses seeking certification; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Waupaca County Board of Supervisors actively supports and currently participates in economic development activities for the benefit of its citizens; and
- **WHEREAS**, the creation of a regional Technology Zone encompassing Marinette, Oconto, Brown, Door, Outagamie, Calumet, Kewaunee, Manitowoc, Shawano, Winnebago, Waupaca, and Fond du Lac counties will promote regional cooperation and will stimulate efficient use of resources.
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Waupaca County Board of Supervisors hereby concurs with the development of a regional Technology Zone encompassing those counties listed above that approve a similar resolution; and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Waupaca County Board Chairman and Clerk be authorized to sign any appropriate forms required in the submission of the Technology Zone application to the Wisconsin Department of Commerce on behalf of Waupaca County; and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that copies of this resolution be transmitted to the County Clerks of Marinette, Oconto, Brown, Door, Outagamie, Calumet, Kewaunee, Manitowoc, Shawano, Winnebago, and Fond du Lac Counties as an expression of Waupaca County's desire to cooperate with them in the Technology Zone; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that two original signed copies of this resolution be forwarded to the Bay-Lake Regional Planning Commission who is providing staff support in the application process.
