# WAUPACA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS ADJOURNED ORGANIZATIONAL SESSION SEPTEMBER 23, 2003

County Board Chair Brown called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with 26 members present.

County Board Chair Brown made the opening statement that this meeting and all other meetings of this board are open to the public. Proper notice has been posted and given to the press, in accordance with Wisconsin Statutes so the citizenry may be aware of the time, place and agenda of this meeting.

Pledge of Allegiance was said by all followed by a moment of silence.

Supr. Flink moved and Supr. Mares seconded the motion to approve the agenda. Motion carried 26-0.

Supr. Rasmussen moved and Supr. Sorensen seconded the motion to approve the minutes from the August 19, 2003 meeting. Motion carried 26-0.

### COMPREHENSIVE PLANNING PROCESS

Supr. Ken Hurlbut, Chairman of the Comprehensive Planning Ad Hoc Committee, reported on the committee's last meeting. Land & Water County Conservationist Bruce Bushweiler and Highway Commissioner Dean Steingraber both agreed to write part of the program for the conservation and highway department, reducing the final contract by \$13,000. The committee voted unanimously to present the process as it stands and the 2 contracts to County Board for their approval. Supr. Hurlbut moved and Supr. Kussmann seconded the motion to approve the Comprehensive Planning Process as presented. Motion carried 25-1 with Supr. Steenbock voting no. Passed this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of September, 2003.

# AMENDMENT TO CHAPTER NO. 34 Town of Dayton, A-G to RS-20 2003-475, Z-2-03

Parcel #03-04-75-21, Z-10-03, in Sec. 4, Town of Dayton for a Zoning Map Amendment from an A-G (General Agriculture) zone to an RS-20 (Residential Single-Family, 20,000 Sq. Ft. Lot Minimum) zone to create two residential lots.

An amendment to amend the Waupaca County Zoning Ordinance by changing the zoning classification of certain specified lands located in part of the SE 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Sec. 4, Town of Dayton, lying along Birchwood Drive, Waupaca County, Wisconsin, on approximately 5 acres.

Subject matter of this ordinance having been duly referred to and considered by the Waupaca County Planning and Zoning Committee and public hearing having been held after the giving of requisite notice of said hearing and a recommendation thereon reported to the Board of Supervisors, Waupaca County, Wisconsin as required by Section 59.97 of the Wisconsin Statutes, said Board does ordain as follows:

- Section 1. The Zoning Map entitled Dayton Township, Detail Map B-17, Waupaca County is hereby amended by changing the zoning classification of the area shown on the attached map, which is made a part of the ordinance from an A-G (General Agriculture) zone to an RS-20 (Residential Single-Family, 20,000 Sq. Ft. Lot Minimum) zone.
- Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect in the Town of Dayton upon filing with the County Clerk of Waupaca County a certified copy of a resolution of the Town Board of Supervisors of said town approving said ordinance or 40 days after the adoption of the ordinance by County Board, unless a certified copy of a resolution disapproving the amendment is filed within ten (10) days with the County Clerk within that time.
- Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with or in contravention of provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

### **RESOLUTION NO. 27 (2003-2004)**

**Subject:** The Health and Human Services Board recommends the elimination of the vacant part-time (60%) Healthy Beginnings Co-Manager (LGL #10) union position and creating a part-time (60%) Healthy Beginnings Specialist (LGL #9) union position effective immediately.

**WHEREAS,** the Healthy Beginnings Program started in Waupaca County in 1995 under the Health Services Division with a Maternal and Child Health (MCH) grant; and,

**WHEREAS,** this program has proven to prevent child abuse and neglect by providing a home visitation education/assistance service to voluntary high risk new parent(s) for up to five years; and,

**WHEREAS**, the program has grown from the initial MCH grant funds of \$7,592 to a program of more than \$293,491 with five different funding sources; and,

**WHEREAS,** staff working within the program have grown from two part-time employees to our current combined employees and contracted workers equivalent to 5.5 FTE program staff; and,

**WHEREAS,** the position changes recommended will finalize the organizational structure for the Healthy Beginnings Program.

**NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED,** that the Waupaca County Board of Supervisors authorizes the Health and Human Services Board to eliminate the vacant part-time (60%) Healthy Beginnings Co-Manager position on the organizational chart and create a part-time (60%) Healthy Beginnings Specialist (LGL 9) position effective immediately.

**AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that no new funds are required to complete these position changes.

### **RESOLUTION NO. 28 (2003-2004)**

# SUPPORTING THE LEGALIZATION OF VIDEO LOTTERY MACHINES IN RESTAURANTS AND TAVERNS LICENSED TO SELL ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ON PREMISES

**WHEREAS,** Wisconsin Statutes Chapter 945 prohibits local restaurants and taverns that hold alcohol beverage licenses for on-premises consumption in an age restricted environment from using gambling devices, including video gambling machines within their places of business; and,

**WHEREAS**, the State of Wisconsin legalized gaming for Indian Tribes, bingo, raffles and certain lottery games; and,

**WHEREAS**, authority should be granted to local restaurants and taverns that hold alcohol beverage licenses for on-premises consumption in an age restricted environment to use video lottery machines and other similar gaming devices by establishing a permitting and licensing process to make those devices available for the use of customers; and,

**WHEREAS**, the licensing procedure would not only give greater control over the use and types of gaming devices located in local restaurants and taverns that hold alcohol beverage licenses for on-premises consumption in an age restricted environment but also would create a penalty that the local business could lose its alcohol license should a non-licensed, registered machine be discovered on the premises.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Waupaca County Board of Supervisors, met in regular session, that the Board of Supervisors goes on record in support of the creation of a licensing process to legalize the use of video lottery machines in local restaurants and taverns that hold alcohol beverage licenses for on-premises consumption in an age restricted environment; and,

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** by the Waupaca County Board of Supervisors that the video lottery system be established under the state lottery program with the following provisions:

1. Machines would be online as part of the lottery and that up to 5 machines be authorized to be on the premises of a "Class B" / Class "B" licensed establishment.

- 2. The program authorize municipalities to charge up to \$250 per machine licensing fee payable to the municipality and a \$50 per machine surcharge to be paid to the County.
- 3. The required minimum payout be equal to that of the Tribal Compacts, namely 83%.
- 4. The adjusted gross receipts would be subject to the applicable state sales taxes.
- 5. The program provide that the state lottery receive 40% of the net proceeds to fill the anticipated shortage in shared revenue in the second year of the state's budget and to meet the constitutional requirement that funds be used for property tax relief; and,

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the County Clerk be authorized and directed to forward a copy of this resolution to the State Department of Administration, Division of Gaming and to Representatives Jean Hundertmark, John Ainsworth, Luther Olsen, State Senators Robert Welch, Robert L. Cowles, and all County Clerks.
