# RESOLUTION NO. 21 (2010-2011) INITIAL RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$11,340,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION PROMISSORY NOTES FOR REFUNDING PURPOSES

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Supervisors of Waupaca County, Wisconsin (the "County") that there shall be issued, pursuant to Chapter 67, Wisconsin Statutes, general obligation promissory notes in an amount not to exceed \$11,340,000 for the public purpose of refunding obligations of the County, including interest on them, specifically: the County's General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2002A, dated June 1, 2002, maturing in the years 2013 through 2017, and the General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2002B, dated July 1, 2002, maturing in the years 2013 through 2017. There shall be levied on all the taxable property of the County a direct, annual, irrepealable tax sufficient to pay the interest on said notes as it becomes due, and also to pay and discharge the principal thereof.

# RESOLUTION NO. 22 (2010-2011) INITIAL RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$3,930,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION PROMISSORY NOTES FOR CAPITAL PROJECTS

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Supervisors of Waupaca County, Wisconsin (the "County") that there shall be issued, pursuant to Chapter 67, Wisconsin Statutes, general obligation promissory notes in an amount not to exceed \$3,930,000 for the public purpose of paying the cost of projects included in the County's capital improvement plan, including highway projects, courthouse and jail improvements and

acquisition of equipment for the Sheriff's Department and the Solid Waste/Recycling Department. There shall be levied on all the taxable property of the County a direct, annual, irrepealable tax sufficient to pay the interest on said notes as it becomes due, and also to pay and discharge the principal thereof.

## RESOLUTION NO. 23 (2010-2011) RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE SALE OF APPROXIMATELY \$16,750,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION PROMISSORY NOTES

WHEREAS pursuant to initial resolutions adopted on October 28, 2008, October 27, 2009 and September 21, 2010, the Board of Supervisors of Waupaca County, Wisconsin (the "County") authorized the issuance of general obligation promissory notes for the public purposes of paying the cost of radio system upgrades for the Sheriff's Department, highway projects, projects included in the County's capital improvement plan and refunding obligations of the County, including interest on them.

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that:

<u>Section 1. The Notes</u>. The County shall issue General Obligation Promissory Notes in an amount of approximately \$16,750,000 (the "Notes") for the purposes above specified.

<u>Section 2. Sale of Notes</u>. The County Board hereby authorizes and directs that the Notes be offered for public sale. At a subsequent meeting, the County Board shall consider such bids for the Notes as may have been received and take action thereon.

Section 3. Notice of Note Sale. The County Clerk is hereby directed to cause notice of the sale of the Notes to be disseminated in such manner and at such times as the County Clerk may determine and to cause copies of a complete, official Notice of Note Sale and other pertinent data to be forwarded to interested bidders as the County Clerk may determine.

Section 4. Official Statement. The County Clerk shall cause an Official Statement concerning this issue to be prepared by the County's financial advisor, Ehlers & Associates, Inc. The appropriate County officials shall determine when the Official Statement is final for purposes of Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c2-12 and shall certify said Statement, such certification to constitute full authorization of such Statement under this resolution.

RESOLUTION NO. 20 (2010-2011)
Waupaca County Board of Supervisors
Resolution Approving the Issuance of Revenue Bonds by a Wisconsin
Bond Issuing Commission (Central Wisconsin Electric Cooperative Project)

WHEREAS, the Central Wisconsin Electric Cooperative, a Wisconsin cooperative association (the "Borrower"), has requested the Public Finance Authority, a Wisconsin bond issuing commission created under Section 66.0304(3) of the Wisconsin Statutes (the "Issuer"), to issue revenue bonds to provide financing for the construction of an office building in Rosholt and various other improvements to the Borrower's existing electric distribution system and related financing costs (the "Project"); and

**WHEREAS,** a portion of which Project is to be located in Waupaca County, Wisconsin (the "County"), as described in the notice of public hearing (the "Notice") attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

**WHEREAS**, the Act provides that the Issuer may not authorize bonds to finance the Project unless all the political subdivisions within whose boundaries the Project is to be located have approved the financing of the Project; and

**WHEREAS,** on August 24, 2010, a public hearing was held before the County Board of Supervisors of Marathon County, Wisconsin with respect to the issuance by the Issuer of the revenue bonds referred to in the Notice (the "**Bonds**") for the purpose of providing financing for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Notice, in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein, was published by at least one insertion no less than 14 days prior to the date of the public hearing in the official newspaper of Marathon County for publication of notices pursuant to Chapter 985 of the Wisconsin Statutes and in a newspaper having general circulation within the locality of the Project; and

**WHEREAS**, such public hearing was conducted in a manner that provided a reasonable opportunity to be heard for persons with differing views on both issuance of the Bonds and the location and the nature of the Project which is to be financed by the Bonds; and

**WHEREAS,** this County Board of Supervisors (the "**County Board**") is an elected legislative body of the County and a political subdivision within whose boundaries a portion of the Project is to be located; and

WHEREAS, the Bonds shall be limited revenue obligations of the Issuer payable solely from revenues provided by the Borrower and derived from the Project, and shall not constitute an indebtedness of the County within the meaning of any State constitutional provision or statutory limitation, and shall not constitute or give rise to a pecuniary liability, direct or contingent, of any kind or degree whatsoever, of the County or a charge against their general credit or taxing powers;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Waupaca County Board of Supervisors that:

**Section 1.** For the purpose of Section 147(f) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and Section 66.0304(11) of the Wisconsin Statutes, the County Board hereby approves the Project (a portion of which will be located in the County) and the financing thereof through the issuance of the Bonds by the Issuer in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed the amount set forth in the Notice attached hereto as Exhibit A.

**Section 2.** The publication of the Notice and any action taken by the County, or on behalf of the County, with respect to the issuance of the Bonds prior to the date hereof is hereby ratified and approved.
