Chair Koeppen called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with 27 members present.

Supr. L. Mares moved and Supr. Flink seconded the motion to approve the minutes of the October 26, 2010. Motion carried 27-0. Passed the 9th day of November, 2010.

PUBLIC HEARING FOR THE 2011 BUDGET AND TRANSPORTATION SERVICES PROGRAM 85.21

Supr. Handrich moved and Supr. Brown seconded the motion to open the public hearing for the 2011 Budget and Transportation Services Program 85.21. Motion carried 27-0. Chair Koeppen opened the public hearing and asked if anyone would like to speak on the budget.

Public input for the budget from Lisa Kuss of Clintonville, Eunice Lawrence of Waupaca, and Kathy Mitchell of Clintonville regarding staying with the Library Plan for funding. Statements are on file in the County Clerk's office.

Chair Koeppen called 3 times for any more public input. Being no further input, Supr. Flease moved and Supr. Brown seconded the motion to close the public hearing and reconvene into regular session. Motion carried 27-0. Passed the 9th day of November, 2010.

RESOLUTION NO. 28 (2010–2011)

SUBJECT: Department of Environmental Resource Management (DERM).

WHEREAS, Waupaca County is responsible for administering a wide range of services designed to protect and improve its natural resources; and

WHEREAS, it is has been determined through a thorough analysis and comprehensive study that the most efficient and cost effective method of providing high quality services in the areas of Land & Water Conservation, Solid Waste, and Parks & Recreation is to create a Department of Environmental Resource Management; and

WHEREAS, the first phase of this reorganization would involve the following adjustments to the Waupaca County listing of authorized positions: re-title the existing SW/Parks Director to DERM Director; expand the County Conservationist to full-time at non-represented labor grade of K; replace an existing Watershed Project Technician position with a Conservation Technician/GIS Specialist at Professional grade level 8; and

WHEREAS, this reorganization has been reviewed by the Committees of Jurisdiction: Land & Water Conservation, Parks & Recreation, Solid Waste Board, Zoning and the Finance and Personnel Committee and have been recommended for approval.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED that the Waupaca County Board of Supervisors does hereby approve the creation of a Department of Environmental Resource Management to oversee the functions of the current Land & Water Conservation, Solid Waste, and Parks & Recreation Departments. The adjustments in staffing will include re-titling the existing SW/Parks Director to DERM Director and expanding the County Conservationist to full-time at non-represented labor grade of K effective January 1, 2011; replace an existing Watershed Project Technician position with a Conservation Technician/GIS Specialist at Professional grade level 8 effective March 1, 2011.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no additional county budget dollars will be required to fund the staffing adjustments.
