Township of Lebanon, Z-007-12, for an amendment to the Waupaca County Zoning Map amending the Rural Residential Zoning District minimum lot size requirement from two (2) acres to one (1) acre.

An amendment to the Waupaca County Zoning Map by changing the minimum lot size requirement from two (2) acres to one (1) acre on all property located in the RR (Rural Residential) District in the entire Town of Lebanon, Waupaca County, Wisconsin. This amendment will be consistent with the standards of the Rural Residential Preferred Land Use Category within the Town of Lebanon Comprehensive Plan and allow for clustering of new single family residential development within the Town.

RE: OPPOSITION TO PROPOSED LAPSE IN STATE FUNDING TO CIRCUIT COURT SYSTEM

WHEREAS, the 2013-15 State Biennial Budget requires the Wisconsin court system to return a total of \$11.8 million to the state general fund over the next two-year period, resulting in budget cuts affecting the Waupaca County circuit court system; and,

WHEREAS, if said budget cuts are made, the Waupaca County circuit court system will no longer receive State funding at its previous level in the form of circuit court payments; interpreter assistance; and guardian ad litem assistance; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed reduction of funding and resulting budget cuts would create an enormous financial challenge to Waupaca County, potentially resulting in an increased tax levy, while striving to meet the challenge of the state levy cap; and,

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of Waupaca County to oppose this proposed budget reduction.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Waupaca County Board hereby states its opposition to the lapse of Wisconsin judicial branch funding to the State general fund over the next two-year period; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Waupaca County Clerk shall forward a copy of this resolution to Waupaca County's State Legislators, Governor Scott Walker, the Director of State Courts, and all other Wisconsin Counties.

RESOLUTION 10 (2014-2015)

Moratorium on permitting of Non-Metallic Mining activities in Waupaca County

WHEREAS Waupaca County Planning and Zoning Department is currently updating their Non-Metallic Mining Ordinance, and

WHEREAS during a public hearing many citizens expressed concern over the effects to air quality, water quality, quality of life, and to the ability of the county to maintain stable communities, and

WHEREAS it is the intention of the Planning and Zoning Department to make sure that the updated ordinance addresses all verifiable concerns, and

WHEREAS Section 59.69(1) Wis. Stats. provides for the use of local zoning authority to regulate inter alia, the use of land and other natural resources in accordance with their character and adaptability, and

WHEREAS the Planning and Zoning Committee will need time to fully investigate and develop said ordinance, and

WHEREAS this moratorium is not intended to apply to non-metallic operations that are expressly exempted by State Statute.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that there be a moratorium starting September 18, 2014 for up to six months, or until the County Board adopts the newly developed Non-Metallic Ordinance, whichever is earlier, that prohibits the expansion of any non-metallic mining operation beyond its physical dimensions as identified in the reclamation plan on file as of the date of adoption of this resolution and further prohibits the creation of any new non-metallic mining operation during the pendency of the moratorium within the unincorporated areas of Waupaca County. The moratorium applies to all such applications for conditional use permits for non-metallic mining operations that are not filed with the Planning and Zoning Department and deemed complete by the Planning and Zoning Director as of September 17, 2013 at 4:00 p.m.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an ad hoc committee appointed by the Waupaca County Planning and Zoning Committee be created with the responsibility to collect and analyze information and make a recommendation on creation of a new Non-Metallic Mining Ordinance that properly addresses all necessary concerns. The ad hoc committee shall report back their findings to the Implementation Steering Committee (ISC) for review and to the Planning and Zoning Committee for approval and recommendation to the full county board for their final approval.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the ad hoc committee be made up of no more than 10 members with no more than 2 members from the Waupaca County Planning & Zoning Committee.
