The Waupaca County Planning & Zoning Committee, having considered the above petition on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of August, 2017 by **Manawa Storage LLC** for a Petition for Zoning Map Amendment from an AE (Agriculture Enterprise) District to an RC-O (Rural Commercial - Overlay) District to create a 2.00 acre parcel for Mini-Warehouses. This property is within Farmland Preservation and will use one (1) development right to create the 2.00 acre parcel.

The following described lands: Located in part of the NE ¼ of the NW ¼ of Sec. 15, Town of Little Wolf, lying along Progress Road, Fire Number E6211, Waupaca County, Wisconsin. (Part of Parcel #13-15-21-1)

Having held public hearings thereon, pursuant to the Wisconsin Statutes, notice thereof having been given as provided by law, and being duly informed of the facts pertinent to the changes proposed, and duly advised of the wishes of the people in the area affected, hereby recommends as follows:

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 20 (2017-2018)**

**SUBJECT:** The Health and Human Services Board is recommending the creation of a Comprehensive Community Services (CCS) Program Support Technician (WC 6).

**WHEREAS**, the State of Wisconsin created the CCS Program for Wisconsin counties to expand mental health services; and,

WHEREAS, the CCS Program for Waupaca County Department of Health and Human Services was certified by the State of Wisconsin in 2015 and provides mental health treatment to children and adults; and,

**WHEREAS**, it has become evident that residents of Waupaca County are in need of the expanded mental health services provided by the CCS Program; and

**WHEREAS**, the growth of the program created the need for additional support to the CCS Coordinator, CCS Facilitator, and other CCS program staff in order for staff to provide critical and expedited mental health services; and

**WHEREAS**, by creating a CCS Support Technician, clerical and fiscal duties and responsibilities can completed by the Support Technician rather in lieu of other program staff who may then concentrate on delivery of program services; and

**WHEREAS,** funding for the CCS Support Technician will be fully covered through the CCS Program without contribution from the County tax levy.

NOW, THERERFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED that the Waupaca County Board of Supervisors authorizes the Department of Health and Human Services to create a CCS (Comprehensive Community Services) Support Technician, (WC 6). This reorganization will be budget neutral. Upon passage of this resolution by Waupaca County Board of Supervisors, the position will become effective immediately.
