OPEN SESSION

Monthly report was reviewed with updates on recruitment, retirement/resignation, benefits and compensation.

Review of new position requests for 2018. Highway Commissioner Beyersdorf discussed the request for a new Equipment Technician which would replace the existing LTE, the request is for a 2017 effective date. Planning & Zoning Director Brown reviewed the request for a position expansion from part-time to full-time. DHHS Director Price reviewed the departments new position request for 2018. Also reviewed were position requests for the Sheriff's Department.

Jenna Bidwell from Carlson Dettmann Consulting was present to review the results of the compensation market study. A full report presentation will be made at the Finance/HR Committee meeting on the 16^{th} .

A resolution was presented for consideration of an increase to the wages for part-time bailiffs. The current rates have not been adjusted since 2008. **MOTION:** Supervisor Federwitz moved and Supervisor Murphy seconded the motion to approve the resolution and recommend to Finance/HR. Motion carried without a negative vote.

A summary report from the County Safety Committee was reviewed. The report identified the required safety testing and training need for compliance, as well as, the priority items. Certain items will need funding to be completed. Options for funding thru workers compensation will be explored.
