LAW ENFORCEMENT MEETING

3 November 2015

The Waupaca County Law Enforcement Committee was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by Chairman Jonely. Members present: Supervisors Craig, Johnson, Handrich, and Wilfuer. Others present: Sheriff Hardel, Chief Deputy Kraeger, Captain Wilz, Captain Rasmussen and Lt. Russell.

Chairman Jonely gave the opening meeting statement that this meeting and all other meetings of this Committee are open to the public. Proper notice has been posted and given to the press in accordance with Wisconsin Statutes so that the citizenry may be aware of the time, place and agenda of this meeting.

Captain Wilz reported for the Communication Center that the deadline for applications for the vacant supervisor position is today. All applicants will see Dr. Fico and interviews are scheduled for November 12.

Lt. Russell gave an update on the Eco Chic Coatings shower project. Work is progressing on the 2nd floor with the target date of December 1 to start the 3rd floor. Interviews are scheduled for the one vacancy in the jail.

Sheriff Hardel and Chief Deputy Kraeger reported for the Detective Division that there continues to be several sexual assault and child abuse complaints during the past month. Our detectives assisted with an infant death last weekend in Iola. There has also been a large amount of mailbox complaints.

Captain Rasmussen reported on Patrol Division statistics. Supervisor Wilfuer moved, Supervisor Handrich second to approve the report. Motion carried without a negative vote. The patrol report was placed on file.

Sheriff's Office report was presented by Chief Deputy Kraeger. Motion to approve the report by Supervisor Johnson, second by Supervisor Wilfuer. Motion carried without a negative vote. The Sheriff's Office report was placed on file.

Sheriff Hardel reported that the Portage County Sheriff had contacted him and he's not sure if their proposed new jail project will go through. They will continue to send safekeepers to us. Sheriff Hardel gave an update on the Jerome Weinmann incident from eight years ago. Sheriff Hardel has been contacted by the DOT about parts of Hwy 10 that will be posted for 70 mph in Waupaca County. Sheriff Hardel expressed his disagreement with this to the DOT.
