

LAW ENFORCEMENT MEETING  
13 DECEMBER 2016

The Waupaca County Law Enforcement Committee was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by Chairman Jonely. Members present: Supervisors Craig, Handrich, Poehlman and Board Chair Koeppen. Others present: Sheriff Brad Hardel, Chief Deputy Allen Kraeger, Captain Conat, Captain Karski, Captain Rasmussen, Captain Wogsland and Lt. Russell.

Chairman Jonely gave the opening meeting statement that this meeting and all other meetings of this Committee are open to the public. Proper notice has been posted and given to the press in accordance with Wisconsin Statutes so that the citizenry may be aware of the time, place and agenda of this meeting.

Motion by Supervisor Koeppen, seconded by Supervisor Poehlman to approve the minutes of the November 1, 2016 meeting of the Law Enforcement Committee. Motion carried without a negative vote.

Motion by Supervisor Craig, seconded by Supervisor Handrich to approve the agenda. Motion carried without a negative vote.

Motion by Supervisor Craig, seconded by Supervisor Handrich to approve the October bills as presented. Motion carried without a negative vote.

Motion by Supervisor Handrich, seconded by Supervisor Poehlman to approve the November bills as presented. Motion carried without a negative vote.

Captain Karski reported for the Communication Center that Megan Waller will be starting in the Comm Center on January 3. Alex Krueger has given his resignation effective January 1 and background checks are being done on one individual.

Captain Wogsland reported for the Jail that there are some issues with the ceiling in the kitchen. The original ceiling above the dishwasher area is steel, which is rusting badly. A motion was made by Supervisor Craig, seconded by Supervisor Handrich to approve \$20,000.00 to have the entire ceiling in the jail kitchen replaced. Tyler Fink started as a correction officer on November 9, which leaves one vacancy. Interviews for an eligibility list will be conducted December 22.

Captain Conat reported for the Detective Division that they have been busy with several burglary and juvenile sexual assault complaints. They are also preparing for the Alison Roe trial in January.

Captain Rasmussen reported on the Patrol Division statistics. A motion was made by Supervisor Poehlman, seconded by Supervisor Koeppen to approve the October and November reports. The motion carried without a negative vote. The patrol reports were placed on file.

The Sheriff's Office report began with a presentation from Emergency Management Director Andy Carlin. Andy said that the 30-year-old tower at the Waupaca County Sheriff's Office doesn't meet current standards. He talked about the Simulcast system currently being used, the use of fiber optic at the Manawa Tower and looking at a filler tower near Weyauwega. This was informational at this time. Upgrades will need to be made at some point to the towers. The Sheriff's Office report was then presented by Chief Deputy Kraeger. A motion was made by Supervisor Handrich, seconded by Supervisor Poehlman to accept the October and November reports. The motion carried without a negative vote and were placed on file.

The Sheriff's Report was given by Sheriff Hardel. He recently attend the Badger State Sheriff's Conference. Shop-With-A-Cop was once again very successful.

The need to make the front doors at the Waupaca County Sheriff's Office handicap accessible was discussed. A motion was made by Supervisor Craig, seconded by Supervisor Poehlman to approve up to \$7,500.00 to make the front doors handicap accessible. Motion carried without a negative vote.

A motion was made by Supervisor Poehlman, seconded by Supervisor Handrich to approve the dance hall application for 2017 at the Indian Crossing Casino. Motion carried without a negative vote.

Supervisor Handrich moved, second by Supervisor Craig to adjourn at 10:35 a.m. Motion carried.
